Target audience

This workshop is suitable for health and social care workers who are involved in the caring and supporting individuals after a loved one has died.

About the course

This workshop aims to provide health and social care workers with an understanding of the basic principles of bereavement care and how these can be effectively applied in practice.

It allows participants to improve their knowledge and skills in palliative care by sharing experiences and ideas using discussion and reflection.

Power-point, group work, practical tips and/or discussion will be used to explore the issues.

Course Objectives

- To examine the theories and models related to grief and bereavement
- To give a foundation for the care of patients and their families around the time of death, and to recognise the reactions following a bereavement.
- To recognise that bereavement can be both normal and complicated, and know when to refer on and who to refer to.
- To describe bereavement reactions for adults and children
- To describe resources and organisations available on the IOM and in the UK that help the bereaved

This workshop underpins the common core competencies and principles for health practitioners working with bereaved individuals.
